II. Annual Election of Chair

President David McFaddin delivered the following report:

EKU Launches Feasibility Study for the College of Osteopathic Medicine

It was announced on January 23, 2024, to all faculty and staff that EKU is exploring the possibility of offering a Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine degree. As the School of Opportunity, EKU's commitment to students and the Commonwealth is to continuously analyze the market and innovate to meet the needs of communities.

The first step is to determine if there is a sustainable need for this program and EKU's capacity to deliver an exceptional Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine degree. To do so, a request for proposal (RFP) has been issued to identify an agency that can complete a feasibility study and make a recommendation.

President's Cabinet Departures

I recently announced to campus the departures of two President's Cabinet members, Senior Vice President of Finance and Administration/Treasurer Barry Poynter and Vice President of Student Life Dr. Dannie Moore will be leaving EKU to pursue endeavors at Berea College and Sam Houston State (respectively). Both will serve until June 30, 2024. It has been an honor to work with both. The intensity with which they were recruited is a reflection of the strong talent we have at EKU. They both will be missed.

2024 Legislative Session

I would first like to thank everyone who took the time to support us during our Colonels at the Capitol Day. We continue to lead from the front in higher education advocacy by bringing our board, administration and key faculty, staff and students to Frankfort for this event.

The legislative session is at the half-way point and all eyes have been on the state budget. Governor Beshear released his proposed budget, which was followed by the release of the House Budget, which passed last Thursday after a 4-hour long floor debate. In addition to general fund support for EKU, the House budget also includes:

- Asset Preservation \$25.9M annually
- Model Lab Phase II \$59.1M
- Fire/tornado insurance (\$3,125,500 annually)
- \$2.8M per year for inflationary cost support on top of our general fund appropriation.

The Senate Budget is likely to be released in the coming weeks. We are working very hard to secure additional funding for an Aviation classroom building, which is estimated at \$25 million. The state budget goes through multiple steps and most agree it won't be finalized until an agreement is reached during the Conference Committee in late March.

Multiple bills that could impact higher education have been introduced. EKU is tracking more than 125 bills, dealing with a variety of subjects: guns on campus, post-tenure review, DEI prohibitions, employee benefits, KEES funding, campus free speech, etc. While many higher education bills have been introduced, very few have been heard in committee or had committee votes. We expect action to pick up in the coming weeks.

HB 407 (which would allow EKU to offer an Osteopathic Medical program) was introduced on January 30th and is being sponsored by House Speaker Pro Tem David Meade. We have almost 30 co-sponsors and passed out of the House Education Committee 17-0 and passed 91-0 on the floor

of the House of Representatives. The legislation will now be heard for discussion tomorrow in the Senate Education Committee at 11:00 a.m. If you want to tune in and hear my testimony just visit the legislative live feed from KET. We continue to meet with legislators to discuss the need for the program (market demand for primary care physicians especially in rural and other underserved areas of Kentucky), to explain why the program is a natural fit for EKU and to secure legislative support.

Finally, while she is not here today because she is in Frankfort, I want to give a big thank you to Amy Scarborough for her tireless work to move our legislative agenda forward during the session, but as she will tell you it is the work done between the sessions that build the relationships and credibility needed to advance EKU when there are so many other opportunities and needs in the state.

Enrollment Update

The Governor announced on January 11, 2024, that Kentucky holds the top spot in the U.S. for higher education enrollment growth compared to 2022-23. The early snapshot of our current enrollment trends is promising for another year of strong growth.

- Spring 2024 headcount enrollment is currently 4.6% greater than last year, with most growth occurring in full-time undergraduate students at nearly 4%
- Overall credit-hour enrollment is up 5.1%
- New transfer enrollment is up 10% compared to Spring 2023
- EKU Online enrollment is up 12.5% over last year
- Current projections for Fall 2024 indicate continued overall enrollment growth

Giving Day

On April 17th we will have one of the most exciting days of the year when we embark on our 6th annual Giving Day event. The goal this year is to have 2,324 donors to commemorate the historical academic year that we have had with record enrollment growth, retention and new and innovative programs that create an undeniable momentum toward the best days ahead for EKU. It was announced during the Fall semester that the Spring 2024 commencement will be held at Alltech Arena at the Kentucky Horse Park in Lexington, KY, due to construction occurring within Alumni Coliseum. Ceremonies are planned for Friday, May 10, 2024, at 9 a.m., 1:30 p.m. and 6 p.m. The commencement committee is hard at work ensuring we can roll out the maroon carpet and give our graduates an exceptional experience on this well-deserved day of celebration. 3. Mr. Mike Eaves, Chair of the Board Report

Chair Eaves thanked Dr. Zeigler for her report. He indicated that he had met with her previously and that he had asked her to begin addressing the board twice a year following graduation, to talk about the successes and failures in between.

He indicated the university is approaching the end of the budget term, so much of the next board meeting will be discussing the proposed university budget for a closer analysis so the board will have a clear understanding of the budget they will be asked to approve.

Chair Eaves mentioned that several board members have asked about the President's contract extension request which has been submitted by the President however the consensus is

that his contract should run on an academic year rather than the calendar year, which will be brought for and discussed at the May board meeting.

B. Approval of Board of Regents Amended Bylaws

University Counsel, Dana Fohl addressed the board regarding a review and revision of the board bylaws which had been requested by the Chair when he began his term. His charge was to ensure that the bylaws accurately reflect the operations and actions of the board. In doing so, they cross-referenced statutes, took a look at what the university's sister institutions were doing, and presented to the board the revised bylaws for approval.

A motion was made by Regent Long to adopt the bylaws with the amendment to strike the revised calendar language and continue setting the upcoming year's board meeting dates at the last board meeting of every year. The motion was seconded by Regent Babbage. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

C. Approval of Model Laboratory School Tuition and Fees for 2024-25

Barry Poynter addressed the board seeking approval of Model Laboratory School Tuition and Fees for 2024-25, a copy of which is incorporated herein and will be included with the official copy of the minutes.

A motion was made by Regent Babbage to approve the Model Laboratory School Tuition and Fees for 2024-25. The motion was seconded by Regent Tye. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

D. Approval of Endowed Match Request

Mary Beth Neiser addressed the board seeking approval of the Endowed Match requests, a copy of which is incorporated herein and will be included with the official copy of the minutes.

A motion was made by Regent Long to approve the Endowed Match Requests. The motion was seconded by Regent Orange. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

E. Approval of Land Lease with the Department of Criminal Justice Training

Counselor Fohl addressed the board seeking approval of a second amendment to the Land Lease with the Department of Criminal Justice to include a roundabout to direct the flow of traffic, a copy of which is incorporated herein and will be included with the official copy of the minutes.

A motion was made by Regent Long to approve the amendment. The motion was seconded by Regent Babbage The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

F. Discussion and/or Action Related to Board Self-Evaluation

Regent Marion, Chair of the Ad Hoc Committee on Governance and Evaluation addressed the board regarding the results of their self-evaluation, which included the tool used to conduct the survey, the key areas of focus, and the aggregated results, a copy of which is incorporated herein and will be included with the official copy of the minutes.

VI. New Business

President McFaddin addressed the board seeking approval of an honorary doctorate for the esteemed author, and native-born Kentuckian, Kim Michele Richardson who would be recognized at the spring commencement ceremony.
